MEMBERS KILLED IN THE WAR.

(With Portraits).

CAPTAIN R. N. ADAMS. (Geneva Section.)

Capt. Ralph Newton Adams, M.C., Royal Fusiliers and R.F.C., who was killed in action October 13th, 1016, was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Newton Adams, 8, Stanley Crescent, W. Born in 1895, he was educated at St. Andrew's Eastbourne, and Charterhouse. After leaving School he spent sometime at Neuchatel to learn French, and there he also learnt to love Switzerland and the Alps. He then went a trip to the East, and on his return was Gazetted in May 1914 to the 7th Royal Fusiliers He proceeded to the front attached to the 4th Battalion in December 1914. He was invalided home in February 1915 and in August 1915 was Gazetted to the R.F.C. as a pilot. He returned to the front in March 1916 and was awarded the M.C. and made Flight Commander in July 1916. The following is the official account of the deed for which he was awarded the M.C.: -" Capt. R. N. Adams, M.C. for conspicuous gallantry and skill. Capt. Adams with 2nd Lt. Vernon as observer, attacked six enemy aeroplanes, when over the enemy lines, and brought one down in flames; assisted by Lt. Cloete he drove off remaining five machines, one of which fell out of control." He was much beloved by all who knew him. He took a great interest in Alpine matters, and had he lived would without doubt have proved an active member of the Association to which he was proud to belong. Capt. Adams once mentioned of a flying colleague of his that, like Tyndall's companions referred to in "Glaciers of the Alps," he would break out into the latest Music Hall ditty when in a tight place.

CAPTAIN W. CROWE. (Jaman Section S.A.C.)


Captain W. Crowe was killed early in the War, in 1814. We have not been able to obtain a portrait or further particulars of this member. He was a member of Ski Club of Great Britain.

2nd LIEUTENANT N. S. DONE, 'AC.' (Diablerets Section.)

We extract the following details from "In Memoriam," by E. E. Roberts, which appeared in the "Alpine Journal" June 1917:— "Lieutenant N. S. Done was born in 1881, and had climbed in the Alps since he was a schoolboy, and his last season finished in the Oberland with three great days in succession on the Nesthorn, Aletschorn and the Jungfrau. His photographs were striking productions and





were often seen at the Alpine Club Exhibitions. He joined the Army in June 1916, University of London O.T.C., and had previously done valuable work as Musketry-Instructor. He was Gazetted a 2nd Lieut. in February 1917. Within a month he went to the Front in France, and was killed on March 10th during an attack on the Somme."

CAPTAIN G. T. EWEN, 'AC.' (Grindelwald Section.)

Joined Manchester Regiment, served nine months in France, Neuve Chapelle, Ypres, etc. Obtained Military Cross. "Led one of the bravest and most daring attacks ever carried out." Wounded at Kut, in Mesopotamia, reported missing, now presumed dead.

LIEUTENANT JOHN H. B. FLETCHER, (Geneva Section.)

Died of wounds in France, May 13th, 1915, in the Hospital at Bethune, and was buried in the cemetery of that town.

LIEUTENANT KENNETH GARNETT, R.F.A. (Montreux Section, S.A.C.)

Lient, K. G. Garnett, R.F.A., M.C., Croix de Guerre, was born July 30th, 1892, at Tynemonth, and was the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Garnett, of The Chestnuts, Hampstead. He was educated at St. Paul's School, and entered Trinity College, Cambridge, in 1911, having obtained the top leaving Mathematical Scholarship from St. Paul's. In 1912 he obtained a First Class in the first part of the Mathematical Tripos, and after read Chemistry and Mechanical Science. He stroked the winning Cambridge eight in the University Boat Race in 1914 (the last race before the war). He was the heaviest man in the heaviest crew that has ever represented either University. He stood 6-ft.-5 in his socks and weighed over 14 stone. Kenneth Garnett loved rock climbing and began at the age of 17. His rock climbing was beautiful to watch, so graceful, so sure and so rapid. When he ascended the Matterhorn he was in the last party to start and the first to return (back Schwartzee 11.30 a.m.) He and Charles Wenham ascended the Lyskam and all four peaks of Monte Rosa in one day, and showed no sign of fatigue at the end, returning to the Riffel Alp Hotel in time for dinner. He did many climbs during the five summers he spent at the Riffel Alp, and his friends often spoke of his brightness and gaiety and how useful he was in a tight corner. He and some of his friends started the Trinity College Alpine Club, and climbed the roof and great chimney at Trinity. On the declaration of war he and some friends manned the steam yacht "Zarefah." and with his brother's sea scouts worked hard in patrolling and mine sweeping. He joined the R.F.A. in January, 1915, and a month after went to France, where he was wounded, and went back to Cambridge to complete his degree course, while still on crutches, taking Honours in the Mechanical Science

Tripos. He then returned to the front and served at Ypres and on the Somme. He received the wound that was to prove fatal at Delville Wood, August 24th, 1016. He returned to England to spend the following year lying on his back and to brighten the lives of all his visitors by the cheeriness of nature which endeared him to his many friends. He received the Military Cross from the King in person while in Hospital. He died just a year after he received his wound. Few could have shown more joy in this life or more hope for the future.

CAPTAIN T, GOOD. (Geneva Section)

Educated Christian Brothers' School, Cork, Nottingham High School, London University and Guys Hospital. Studied medicine at Lausanne, Geneva, and Freiburg, in Baden. When war broke out he obtained a Commission in the Royal Dublin Fusiliers in September 1914. Captain in 1915. Died of wounds September 8th, 1916. Married in November, 1915, and leaves one son born the day after his decease.

CAPTAIN CYRIL KING-CHURCH. (Geneva Section.)

Cyril King-Church was born in 1878. He was one of the founders of our Association and the first Treasurer, and a constant attendant at our meetings. He climbed for several seasons in Switzerland between 1905 and 1912 and was particularly neat and safe on rocks. At the dinner at Saas Fee in August 1912, to celebrate the opening of the Cabane Britannia, he made an excellent little speech in French quite impromptu, as he was only called on at the moment to do so. He was educated at Bradfield College, Foundation Scholar 1890 to 1897. He subsequently obtained a scholarship at Oriel College Oxford, 1897 to 1901, and obtained Honours. He was a member of the Oxford University O.T.C. After leaving the University he took two or three tutorships before he was appointed one of the Assistant Secretaries of the Charity Organization Society. When the National Health Insurance Act was passed in 1912 he was appointed an Assistant Inspector, which post he held until the outbreak of War, when he was called on to join his Battalion of the London Regiment (Territorials), to which he had belonged since 1910. He had passed a special course of musketry in 1911, and was Musketry-Instructor to the Battalion. In April 1914 he was Gazetted as a Captain. He left for France in March 1915, and, after six months work in the trenches, was killed while leading his company in the storming of the Double Crassier at Loos, on September 26th, 1915. He was buried at Houchin Cemetery. His loss was deeply regretted by those who knew him, and his pleasant humour, courtesy and charm of manner endeared him to all with whom he came in contact. CAPTAIN C. E. KING-CHURCH,

LIEUTENANT MILES MILEY. (Geneva Section.)

Educated at Rugby, 1903-1908, and Trinity College, Cambridge. First Class Math. Tripos, Pt. I (1909). First Class Mechanical Science Tripos 1911. Peter Leigh Exhibition (for members of Trinity College obtaining Double Firsts). Wounded December 29th, 1915, and died on the following day, aged 26. "I was always glad my son took so keenly to the mountains. The sport is to my mind the best of all. A man is not out to kill anything except perhaps himself, and to avoid doing so he has to cultivate courage, self reliance and control. and sometimes the highest form of self sacrifice. These virtues he possessed, and we are still slowly and painfully learning to bear the loss now, quite sure that we shall look back only with pleasure and pride, and gratitude beyond words, that such a possession had been ours, and that he cheerfully and willingly gave his life for us."

CAPTAIN R. SEBAG MONTIFIORE. (Geneva Section.)

Captain in the Royal East Kent Mounted Rifles, was a member of London County Council (M.) and stood unsuccessfully for Parliament in the Conservative interest. He died from wounds in 1915 (Dardanelles).

2nd LIEUTENANT E. D. MURRAY. (Diablerets Section.)

A member of the Alpine Club and on the Committee of our Association. Born 1884. Joined Artists' Rifles, and later received a Commission in the Black Watch. Killed in France in 1914 (see In Memoriam, Alpine Club Journal, by Lieut. N. S. Done, Vol. xxx., p. 336, October, 1916.)

LIEUTENANT THOMAS DARWIN OVERTON. (Geneva Section S.A.C.)

Lieut. T. D. Overton was killed August 1915, aged 21. He obtained a commission in the Lincolnshire Regiment shortly after his return from the Alps in August 1914. He went out to Gallipoli at the end of July 1915, and was killed near Cape Helles a few days after his arrival, being shot by a sniper as he was talking to another officer in the trenches. He was born in 1894, and was the second son of the Rev. Arnold Overton, now Rector of East Barnet. He was a scholar of Winchester and won a Classical Scholarship at New College in December 1912. Being a first cousin of my wife, I saw a good deal of him while he was at Winchester, and as he got older and accompanied his parents on occasional visits to Switzerland it became clear that he had set his heart on climbing. He was allowed to accompany me, with some other young Wykehamists, to North Wales, where he made the acquaintance

of its steep cold rocks in Tanuary 1912. He went to Switzerland again with his parents in 1913 and did some easy snow expeditions, but 1914 was his first and only real climbing season. We were to have been a party of five, but only Overton and another Wykehamist, whom he had been tutoring, got out with me before war broke out. During the French mobilization travelling was practically impossible, and we were not reluctant to accept the fate which detained us for nearly three We had the mountains to ourselves; the glaciers that in ordinary seasons would be scored by tracks in all directions were deserted and untrodden. Before he came back, Overton had climbed Mont Dolent, Mont Blanc de Seilon, the Matterhorn, the highest peaks of Monte Rosa and the Lyskamm. Overton was a scholar without a trace of pedantry, conceit or affectation, and he loved the things a good father would wish his son to love. Having seen him on his climbs and knowing what happiness they gave him, I thank Providence for allowing him those three precious weeks of August. How often must they have been recalled in the months that followed, for they stored for him the treasure-house from which the climber refreshes himself with beloved memories and golden dreams. The friend who shared our toils and pleasures, and who saw real mountains for the first time, is gone too, being killed at Romani, in August 1916. The laughter, the enthusiasm and the worship of their short Alpine season are locked up in the sacred mystery of the great peaks.

LIEUTENANT E. S. PHILLIPS. (Geneva Section).

The London Regiment. Killed in action in France, May 7th, 1915.

LIEUTENANT A. BLACKWOOD PORTER: (Diablerets Section.)

Educated at Rugby and New College, Oxford. Joined Highland Light Infantry. Killed in action October 3rd, 1915, at Vermelles.

CORPORAL A. I. PRICHARD. (Geneva Section).

Educated at Felstead School (Scholar). He afterwards obtained an Open Scholarship at Queen's College, Cambridge. Honours degree. Passed Civil Service Class I., and was appointed to H.M. Office of Works, and later as Private Secretary to Lord Emmott, the First Commissioner. On the outbreak of War he applied for a Commission in the Army but was rejected four times on account of his eyesight. He then volunteered for the army and enlisted in the Post Office Rifles as a private. He was killed at Vimy Ridge, May 21st, 1916, aged 35, and was buried where be fell, within 100 yards of the German trenches. His Chief, Lord Emmott, writes to his father: "I shall never forget the light that shone in your son's face when I told him he was to be given leave to offer his services."

CAPTAIN C. J. REID, 'AO.' (Altels Section, S.A.C.)

It seems impossible to think that the Alps and Penygwryd will know "C. J." no more, for no one ever more thoroughly enjoyed a holiday in the hills. With the coming of each New Year he looked forward to Easter with its ten days or a fortnight at Penygwryd, and when that

was over came the planning of a campaign in the Alps.

In the earlier days of his climbing career he had made most of the ordinary ascents in the Swiss Alps with guides, but latterly he had taken almost a dislike to climbing with professional assistance and would far rather climb a second-rate or third-rate peak without guides than a first-class peak with them: in fact, in his last three seasons he never made an expedition with a guide. His perfect balance and its natural accompaniment, a sure foot, rock-climbing ability of a high order, great powers of endurance, and a temper calm and unruffled under any circumstances, made him an addition to the strength of any party. He always tried to make others lead, but when he himself led, no man got a keener pleasure out of leading on an expedition, whether it was a high peak, or a pass, or a rock-contour on the Riffelhorn.

He was a fine athlete, a rugger blue at Oxford, playing for the team in 1896, and kept wicket for the 'Varsity for a few weeks, till his hands

went.

Haileybury, Oxford, and back to Haileybury. Such was his working life. What his loss has meant to Haileybury, I leave it to Old Haileyburians to say. As boy, master, house-master and officer of the O.T.C. he gave of his best to his school. And when the call came in 1914, he joined up without hesitation, and his fate took him to Gallipoli.

2nd LIEUTEMANT R. K. STIRLING. (Geneva Section.)

and Lieut. Richard Kellock Stirling, Royal Fusiliers, was educated at Exeter School and Exeter College, Oxford, and, at the outbreak of war, was qualifying for the Bar and eating his dinners at the Middle Temple. He was a keen athlete and, in the Summer of 1913, he paid his first visit to Switzerland where, around Arolla, he gained his first experience of climbing, of which he became very fond. A Scholarship at Exeter School, open to the sons and descendants of officers who have fallen in the War, has been founded in his memory. He was killed in action in France, in August, 1915, aged 22.

H.K.B.

LIEUTENANT W. M. VINCENT. (Diablerets Section.)

Educated at Haileybury and afterwards at Yverdon in Switzerland. Admitted a Solicitor in July, 1914. He climbed in Switzerland with Louis Amynet, of Gryon. He joined the Inns of Court O.T.C. in September, 1914. He was killed at the attack on Gaza, March 26th, 1917.

2nd LIEUTENANT K. T. D. WILCON. (Monte Rosa Section.)


Educated at Westminster School, where he was a King's Scholar. Went up to Oxford in 1913 as Westminster Exhibitioner of Christ Church. He was very fond of games—fives, racquets, tennis. etc., and was in his School cricket eleven, and frequently represented the School at Association football. At Oxford, in his first term, he was given his colours in Association football. He took up Skiing in the winters of 1912 to 1914 at Chambery and Grindelwald. He began climbing in North Wales, and while he was still 16 he had climbed the Pigne, Besso and Allalinhorn. In 1912 he climbed for a fortnight The Monch, etc., but the weather was very unfavourable that year. After war broke out he obtained a Commission in the Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment, and was killed near Ypres on November 8th, 1915, aged 20. The funeral service was read over him by his father, the Rev. A. G. Wilcox, C.F.

CAPTAIN R. D. SQUIRES, 'AC.' (Geneva Section.)

Was a well known Indian climber and soldier. He climbed with the late Major Corry. He was killed in action 1915.

SIR GEORGE RADFORD, M.P. (Geneva Section.)

We all feel deep regret at the loss of our Vice-President, Sir G. H. Radford, M.P., who died on October 5th, 1917, aged 66. His charming personality and his invariable good temper endeared him to us all. He had the keenest sense of humour, and a fresh and unusual way of putting even commonplaces. When he spoke we expected to be interested and amused, and we were not disappointed. He was one of the speakers at the dinner at Saas Fee, after the opening of the Cabane Britannia. His youngest daughter had carried the banner presented to us by Geneva, in August, 1912. He was a constant attendant at our Informal Club Dinners, except when his parliamentary duties prevented him. He knew Switzerland well, and since 1870. He was never a great climber, but to the last he undertook long expeditions and could hold his own with men to years his junior. He was an L.L.B. of London University. Admitted a Solicitor in 1872. Member of the L.C.C. 1895 to 1907. M.P. for East Islington since 1906. Was the author of "Occasional Verses," "Shylock and others" and "Falstaff" (Obiter dicta). On July 19th, 1916, our Committee "past and present," entertained him at a dinner, when a vote of congratulation to him on his Knighthood was passed. We sent, in the name of our Association, a wreath to his funeral, at Lydford, Devon, and a message of condolence to Lady Radford and the family.

THE ASSOCIATION OF BRITISH MEMBERS

OF THE

SWISS ALPINE CLUB.

RULES.

NAME.

The name of the Association shall be "The Association of British Members of the Swiss Alpine Club."

2. OBJECTS.

- (a) To encourage British Alpinists to support the Swiss Alpine Club in all its work, by becoming members of a section of that body.
- (b) To collect funds and present to the S.A.C. a club hut, and for such other purposes as the Association may from time to time determine.
- (c) To form a body able to present a collective opinion to the S.A.C. on any question of Alpine interest.
- (d) To promote among British members the sociability which is so conspicuous a feature of the Swiss sections, but from which we are necessarily debarred by living at a distance from the head-quarters of our sections. This is done by Monthly Informal Dinners, Lectures, Smoking "At Homes," and Showing Alpine Slides on the Lantern.

3. CONSTITUTION.

Officers.—President
Vice-Presidents
Two Hon. Secretaries
Hon. Treasurer
Hon. Anditor

To be elected annually, in November or December

with power to the Committee to increase the number of Officers by two if it is so desired.

Members.-1. Ordinary. The qualification for ordinary membership shall be "membership of some section of the S.A.C."

2. Honorary. To be elected at the discretion of the Committee.

4. SUBSCRIPTION.

The Annual Subscription to the Association shall be 5/- per annum, payable at election. The payment of £2 2s. shall be considered as equivalent to the annual payment of 5/.

Annual Subscriptions shall be due on 1st January of each year and any member whose subscription shall not have been paid on or before the 1st April shall cease to be a member of the Association, but may be reinstated on payment of arrears, at the discretion of the Committee. Any member joining after the 1st November shall not be required to pay his subscription for the ensuing year.

5. GENERAL MEETINGS.

There shall be at least two General Meetings in the year, viz., The Annual General Meeting and a dinner in November or December, a more informal meeting in June, and such Winter meetings as the Committee may think fit

6. POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

- (a) The Committee may, by a two-third majority of those present, call upon any member to resign if they consider his conduct to be incompatible with Membership of the Association, but such member shall have the right of appeal to the next general or special general meeting, which shall have the power of confirming or annulling, by a two-third majority, the decision of the Committee.
- (b) The Committee, on the requisition of 12 members, may call, at any time, a Special General Meeting, provided that seven clear days' notice shall be given to all members of such a Special General Meeting, together with full information as to the place, time, and business to be transacted.

(c) The Committee shall have the power to submit any new proposal affecting the Association to a General or Special General Meeting of the members of the Association.

7. COMMITTEE.

The Committee shall consist of ex-officio members and ordinary members.

- (a) The ex-officio members shall be the officers of the Association for the time being.
- (b) The ordinary members of the Committee shall be 12 in number; and shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Association; one-third of these shall retire annually and shall be eligible for re-election after *one year has elapsed. The Committee may co-opt not more than three additional members, one of whom must retire yearly; the mode of election and the manner of retirement to rest with the Committee. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

* Year ends 31st December.

The Committee may suggest names for Officers and Committee, but this is not to be taken as precluding any two members from nominating candidates, whose consent, however, must be previously obtained.

At least three weeks' notice of the Annual Meeting shall be given to every member; and nominations for Officers and Committee must be sent in to the secretaries at least ten days before the Annual Meeting. In the event of more candidates being nominated than there are vacancies the election shall be by ballot.

8. ACCOUNTS.

The accounts of the Association shall be audited in January and presented by the Treasurer at the next General Meeting of the Club, and shall be published with the Annual Report.

9. CASUAL VACANCIES.

The Committee shall have power to fill up casual vacancies amongst the Officers or Committee; and those chosen shall serve for the unexpired period of office to which the member whom they succeed was entitled.

10. ROOM FOR MEETINGS and LIBRARY.

The Committee shall have power to hire premises for the purposes of the Association, and have done so at Gatti's, 436, Stand, W.C.

11. AN ANNUAL REVIEW.

The Committee shall have power to publish an Annual Review and appoint an Editor when they think the funds of the Club will permit.

12. ALTERATION OF RULES.

A General Meeting shall have power, by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members present and voting to alter or add to the existing rules of the Club.

13. REGULATIONS.

The Committee shall have power to make such regulations, not being inconsistent with these rules, as they think to be for the well-being of the Club.

14. THE CHAIRMAN.

The Chairman whether at a General Meeting or at a Meeting of the Committee shall in case of an equality of votes have a second or casting vote.

15. MONTHLY INFORMAL DINNERS.

These are held at our Club Room, 436, Strand, on 4th Wednesday in each mouth. Price 4/6 (during the War).

HOW TO BELONG TO SWISS ALPINE CLUB.

Those who do not yet belong to the Swiss Alpine Club and desire to do so, can be put up at once, even if they do not wish to belong to our Association. They should write to the Treasurer, J. A. B. Bruce. Selborne Lodge, Guildford, and state whether they wish to join a French. German, or Italian speaking section. The subscription varies slightly in the various sections, e.g., in Geneva 18 francs a year and 10 francs entrance fee. The Association can arrange to pay the subscription to the S.A.C. yearly, or will supply Banker's Forms for that purpose. If the first year's subscription and entrance fee is sent the candidate can be elected at once. If he wishes to obtain the full advantage of membership he should also enclose a small photograph of himself, this will be endorsed by our Treasurer and returned on his card of membership. If, in addition, he wishes to belong to our Association in England, the subscription is only 5/-a year or £2 2s. for life.

The Central Committee of the Swiss Alpine Club have cordially approved of the formation of our Society, and most of the British members have joined our Association.

[.] The subscription in English money varies slightly also with the rate of exchange.

ADVANTAGES OF BELONGING TO THE SWISS ALPINE CLUB.

Members of the Club obtain reductions on certain Swiss Railway (e.g., half-price on Zermatt Railway) half-price at certain Huts; a RIGHT of entry at the Club Huts, instead of being there on SUFFERANCE; a fortuightly paper and monthly magazine in a French section free; the Jahrbüch, a well-illustrated Annual, half-price (6 francs), and other advantages. In a German speaking section the Jahrbüch is compulsory and included in minimum subscription, but the Echo des Alpes is extra.

A good feeling is created amongst the Swiss when they see British climbers, who use their Huts, contributing to their support by becoming members of the S.A.C.

Club Hut Album contains pictures of all the S.A.C. Huts, and

descriptions; it is issued as a supplement to Jahrbüch.

Informal Dinners (4/6) are held by the British Members at their Club Room, 136, Strand, W C., on the 4th Wednesday in each month, except August and December, at which members who are interested in climbing meet and become acquainted with one another. Lantern slides are generally shown after the dinner.

INSURANCE OF GUIDES.

The S.A.C. contributes one half the cost of insurance, if the guide pays the other half.
